Oklahoma State Cowboy Football Postgame Notes vs. Nebraska Saturday, Oct. 13, 2007

- Oklahoma State's 45-14 win over Nebraska gave the Cowboys their first back-to-back victories over the Huskers since 1960 and 1961.
- OSU has now won three of its last four meetings with the Huskers.
- OSU's win was just its second in 22 tries in Lincoln and first since 1960.
- OSU's 551 yards of total offense were the most ever against Nebraska.
- OSU held Nebraska to 101 yards of total offense in the first half, marking the lowest output in a half for a Cowboy
 opponent this season.
- With its 317 rushing yards, OSU has now rushed for 200 yards in six consecutive games.
- OSU's offense finished with 234 passing yards and 317 rushing yards, giving the Cowboys their fourth consecutive game with at least 200 passing and rushing yards.
- OSU's 173 yards of total offense was its highest first-quarter total output this season.
- With its 38 points in the first half, OSU has now outscored its opponents 55-0 in the first half in its last two games combined.
- OSU's 90-yard scoring drive in the second quarter was its third drive of 90 or more yards this season. At 1:52, it was also the Cowboys' 14th scoring drive of less than two minutes this season.
- With his 212 rushing yards, senior running back Dantrell Savage has now reached the century mark in four consecutive games.
- Savage's rushing total was also a career high, surpassing his previous best of 134 yards against Texas A&M in 2006.
- Sophomore Zac Robinson recorded his fourth 200-yard passing game of the season with his 234 yards against the Huskers.
- With his 100 receiving yards, senior Adarius Bowman became the first Cowboy since D'Juan Woods in 2005 with three consecutive 100-yard receiving games.
- With his two touchdown runs, senior fullback Julius now has 130 career points, moving him past Tone Jones into sole possession of 17th place on the school's all-time scoring list.
- Crosslin now has two multi-touchdown games this season. He also ran for a pair of touchdowns against Troy.
- With his eight points against the Huskers, junior kicker Jason Ricks moved past Lawson Vaughn into ninth place on the school's all-time scoring list with 203.

- Junior wide receiver Seth Newton's 41-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter was his first career touchdown reception and the longest catch of his career. The play capped a 3-play, 55-yard drive that covered 26 seconds, marking the seventh scoring drive under one minute this season.
- Freshman running back Kendall Hunter's 33-yard touchdown run in the second quarter was his fourth touchdown of 30 or more yards this season.
- Sophomore Perrish Cox's interception in the second quarter was his second of the season and the fourth of his career.
- Sophomore quarterback Zac Robinson's three-yard touchdown run in the second quarter was his third rushing touchdown of the season.
- Senior linebacker Donovan Woods recorded the fourth forced fumble of his career as well as his second career sack.
- Senior linebacker Jeremy Nethon recorded his first career fumble recovery.
- Senior defensive end Rodrick Johnson recorded his first career interception.
- Sophomore defensive end Derek Burton made the first start of his career.
- Senior Zach Carter also made the first start of his career.
