KANSAS STATE AT NEBRASKA by the numbers...

85,998 - Attendance at Memorial Stadium on Saturday evening.

3,828 - Career all-purpose yards by K-State wide receiver Brandon Banks... Finished his career third in school history for all-purpose yardage.

2,097 - All-purpose yards by K-State wide receiver Brandon Banks this season... With his 143 yards tonight, he finished his career second in school history.

1,265 - Rushing yards for Daniel Thomas this season... His total ranks fourth-highest for a season in school history.

164 - Number of consecutive games Kansas State has scored, which extends K-State's school record streak and improves the 10th-longest streak in the nation.

123 - Career receptions for senior wide receiver Brandon Banks, which ranks seventh in school history.

52 - Temperature at kickoff at Memorial Stadium. This was three degrees warmer than the game time temperature against Kansas in Manhattan on Nov. 7.

44 - Distance of a first quarter field goal by Josh Cherry... It marked the third-straight week that Cherry hit a field goal of 40 or more yards.

42 - Distance of Tysyn Hartman's interception return, the longest by a Wildcat this season.

15 - Tackles by senior linebacker Ulla Pomele, the most by a Wildcat since 2003.

10 - Number of tackles-for-loss by Kansas State... It was the second most this season.

0 - Touchdowns scored by K-State. The last time K-State did not score a touchdown was Oct. 14, 2006, in a 21-3 loss to Nebraska.

POSTGAME NOTES

- K-State is now 15-77-2 all-time against Nebraska... Under head coach Bill Snyder, the Wildcats are 5-13 against the Cornhuskers... Bill Snyder's career record now stands at 142-74-1 (.657)... Snyder has 141 wins since 1990, the sixth-most among active coaches... The Wildcats finished with an 0-5 record on the road this season... Since the 1991 season and under Bill Snyder, the Wildcats are 41-13 (.774) in games played in the month of November... Since the start of the Big 12 in 1996, K-State is 44-26 (.628) against teams from the Big 12 North... The Wildcats are now 11-4-1 when needing a win to become bowl-eligible.

- Kansas State finished the season 6-6 overall and 4-4 in the Big 12... It was the seventh time in school history that the Cats finished with a .500 record... It was also the second .500 record in Big 12 play... The four conference victories by K-State were the most since also winning four in 2006.

- Kansas State extended its scoring streak to 164 consecutive games on Josh Cherry's 44-yard field goal in the first quarter... The streak is the 10th longest in the nation and the second longest in the Big 12 behind Nebraska's 173-game streak... It also marked the seventh time this season the Cats have scored on its opening possession of the game... It was also the sixth time this season K-State have driven 50 or more yards on its opening possession.

- K-State tallied 10.0 tackles-for-loss... It was the second-most this season behind the 12.0 the Wildcats recorded against Texas A&M... The Cats' 10.0 TFLs went for a total loss of 43 yards, the third most this season behind 64 yards against Texas A&M and 44 yards against Tennessee Tech.

- Tysyn Hartman intercepted a second-quarter pass in the end zone and returned it 42 yards... It was the fifth interception of the season for Hartman and his first since the Texas A&M game on October 17... His five picks are tied for the 11th most in school history and are the most since James McGill had six in 2003... The 42 yard return was the longest since Alex Hrebec returned an interception 51 yards against Iowa State on November 22, 2008.

- Running back Daniel Thomas rushed 19 times for 99 yards... Thomas improved his season and career rushing yardage total to 1,265, which ranks fourth in school history for a season and is ranked 18th in school history for a career... Darren Sproles is the only player in school history to have rushed for more yards in a season (1,986 in 2003; 1,465 in 2002; 1,318 in 2004)... Thomas' rushing total is the second-highest season total by a junior in school history (Darren Sproles, 2003 - 1,986).

- Wide receiver Brandon Banks caught five passes for 48 yards... He also returned three kickoffs for 50 yards, while he returned two punts for 27 yards... Banks finished his career ninth in school history in career receiving yardage with 1,754, while he moved into seventh in career receptions with 123... Banks finished with 143 all-purpose yards to remain third in school history with 3,828... His season total of 2,097 all-purpose yards ranks second in school history for a season.

- Grant Gregory made the eighth start of his career on Saturday at Nebraska... Gregory finished the game 11-of-31 for 126 yards with one interception... He also rushed 13 times for 52 yards.

- Josh Cherry hit a 44-yard field goal to open the game's scoring... It marked the third-straight week Cherry has hit a field goal of at least 40-yards... It was his third-longest field goal of the season behind a pair of season-long 47-yards against Kansas and Missouri... Cherry missed a 51-yard field goal at the end of the first half, which was a career-long attempt.

- Wide receiver/quarterback Collin Klein attempted and completed his first career pass... He connected with Daniel Thomas on a 27-yard play in the third quarter, giving K-State 1st and 10 on the Nebraska 18.

- Senior linebacker Ulla Pomele tallied 15 tackles, setting a new career high... His previous career high of 12 came against Colorado on Oct. 18, 2008... His 15 tackles were the most by a Wildcat since Ted Sims had 15 tackles at Texas on October 4, 2003.
